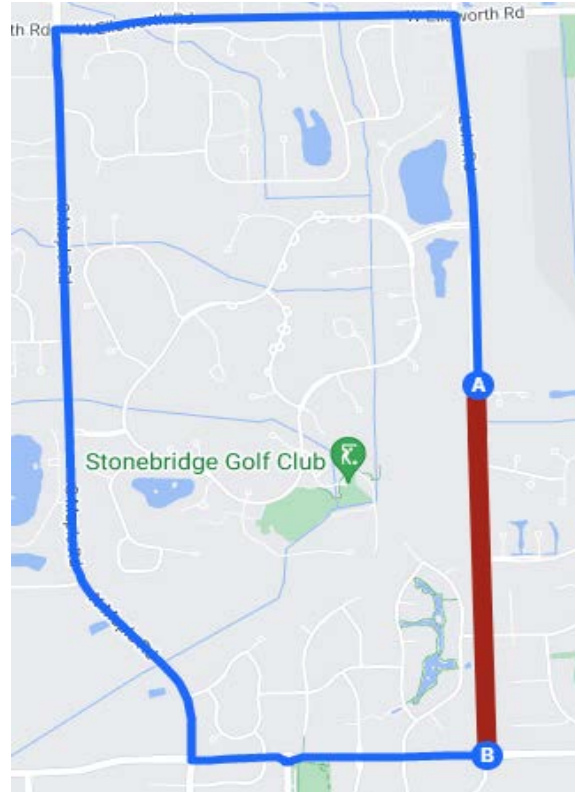
Weather permitting, the reopening of Lohr Road will be Friday, **May 5<sup>th</sup>**

Residents will see increased police presence in the neighborhoods east and west of Lohr Rd. to minimize safety concerns involving traffic. There will be barricades and signs used to advise motorists of the detour route with posted no traffic outlets through the residential neighborhoods.

Nextdoor and the above public safety email can be used to report traffic violations (speed, stop sign, careless driving, etc.) Note: Cut-through traffic alone is not a violation. Call 911 for emergency police or fire response.

**Pittsfield Twp. Police :**

**Residents will see increased police presence in the neighborhoods east and west of Lohr Rd. to prevent or minimize traffic safety concerns involving traffic. There will be barricades and signs used to advise motorists of the detour route with no traffic outlets posted through the residential neighborhoods.**
